





Railroad Heritage Fountain

Water Studio executed two custom water features as a pivotal element of The City of Denison, Texas' Main Street revitalization project. The concept design was conceived by Landscape Architect Chris Lambka, drawing inspiration from the city's rich railroad history, particularly its role as a prominent hub for the renowned Missouri-Kansas-Texas Railroad, commonly known as the Katy. Each 8 ft. long copper podium with a dark bronze patina finish is designed to signify a railway car. Six spouts gracefully disperse streams of water along the shorter sides, while water gently cascades down all facets of these podiums. Stainless steel block letters of "K," "A," "T," and "Y" prominently pay homage to the railroad's significant heritage.
